The Elections and Nominating advisory committees are seeking candidates for positions that will open July 1.

Residents interested in helping the community through these committees should turn in their applications to the front desk inside Palmetto Commons by Friday, April 8. Candidate interviews will be conducted between Saturday, April 9 and Saturday, April 30.



The nine-member Elections Committee conducts the annual elections for the resident Board of Directors and Neighborhood Representatives, and for new neighborhoods as the need arises. Committee members also develop election policies that are submitted to the Board for approval.

The five-member Nominating Committee recruits and encourages qualified Sun City residents to run for resident Board of Directors' positions each year. Part of the committee's responsibilities includes holding informational meetings for prospective candidates.

To apply for either committee, submit either a paper or an online application form. Paper applications can be picked up at Palmetto Commons. Apply online by logging onto the Sun City website (www.SCHHCA.com), then locating the appropriate committee under the groups menu. Click on the link to the application form, complete the form online, and press "Submit."

Fitness Program Scheduling

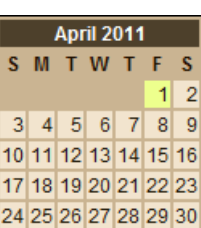

The project is meant to make the community more secure and is being conducted by the IT Department, with assistance from Safety & Service and Security.

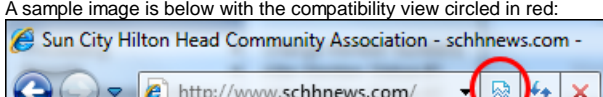
Chelsea System Fixed
